The Role and Responsibility of the Husband

Ephesians 5:20-28

- There are many issues and problems that are facing marriages today.
- The problems that we are facing are many because it starts with the head (husband).
- Many of the negative issues facing us today can be traced to the breakdown of the family.
- The only way we can come back to God’s original design for the family is by coming back to God’s Word.
- What many men do when they are out from under God’s head ship is to seek to get out of the relationship.
- Satan disrupted the first marriage by switching the order in the relationship.
- Every Christian husband must recognize that he is under the authority of Jesus Christ (1 Cor. 11:3).

- **Let's look at some of the responsibilities and role of a Christian husband.**
- 1. The Christian husband is to love his wife (v. 25).**
 - **The word "love" has become devalued today. Biblical love involves the sacrifice you make for the loved one.**
 - A. The Christian husband is to be a savior for his wife.**
 - B. The Christian husband is to be a sanctifier (Eph. 5:26).**
 - C. The Christian husband is to be a satisfier (Eph. 5:28).**

- 2. The Christian husband is to be a visionary.**
 - A. Being a true visionary is a lost art today (Prov. 29:18).**
 - B. Males have built-in qualities enabling them to receive the vision and to bring it to pass.**
- **Prerequisites for Discovering Vision:**
 - 1. Follow Christ's example.**
 - 2. Acknowledge Christ's headship.**
 - 3. Listen for God's direction.**
 - 4. Be open to God's communication.**
