- A. The author of stewardship is God (Stewardship began with God and it will end with God).
- B. The attitude of stewardship is gratitude.
- C. The authority of stewardship is the Word of God.
- D. The adversary of stewardship is Satan.
- E. The accountability of stewardship.
- Lesson #2 Wise and Faithful Stewards Over Opportunities Eph.
 5:15-17
- We must know how to see and seize opportunities.
- What are the opportunities we must steward in this 21st century?
- 1. Opportunity to walk in wisdom by looking around and watching every step (v. 15).
- 2. Opportunity to evangelize (v. 16).
- 3. Opportunity to know the will of God (v. 17).

Wise and Faithful Stewards Over Vision - Proverbs 29:18

- "Where there is no vision [no redemptive revelation of God], the people perish; but he who keeps the law [of God, which includes that of man] – blessed (happy, fortunate, and enviable) is he." (Amplified Bible)
- "Without revelation people run wild but one who follows divine instruction will be happy" (Christian Standard).
- "Vision" means "revelation."
- Vision of Love & Faith "To equip the saints of God for the work of ministry."

- What is vision? Spiritual vision is a gift of God.
- 1. It is a divinely empowered ability to see something that doesn't yet exist in the physical realm.
- 2. Vision is seeing the future before it comes into being.
- 3. It is a mental picture of your completed assignment.
- 4. It is the ability to see farther than your physical eyes can look.
- Vision is the source and hope of life.
- Throughout the Bible we see examples of God giving spiritual vision to ordinary people such as Noah, Abraham, and Moses.
- A vision from God always requires patience (Heb. 2:2-4).
- Three things that happen while we wait.
- 1. The vision must mature in us (2 Thess. 3:13).
- 2. We must mature in preparation for vision.
- 3. God is at work behind the scenes preparing the way.
- Look at three men that had to mature for vision: Noah, Abraham, and Moses.
- God speaks to us today through four means:
- 1. He gives instructions and direction through His Word.
- 2. He converses with us in prayer.
- 3. He guides our thinking through His Spirit.
- 4. He speaks to us through the gifts of the Spirit.
- Each one of us is on a journey; going through time on a course that begins at a point of God's choosing and ends at a juncture known only to Him.
- Three reasons to have spiritual vision.
- 1. We need vision to find our way on life's journey.
- 2. We need vision to keep our focus on life's goal.
- 3. We need vision to set our hearts on life's reward.
